This month we have Lou Ann Fisher giving a lecture on how to make a one block wonder with a panel. Sounds like fun.


We have lots to talk about this month. The membership drive will begin. The auction date is set for 2026.

March 11, 2025

I hope you are all as excited as I am to hear Louann Fisher, our speaker this month. Kaleidoscope and One Block Wonder quilts have always fascinated me, and Louann will be explaining how you can incorporate them with Panels to make one-of-a-kind masterpieces!!

April 8, 2025

Our April Program will be our Annual Pillow Stuffing event. Joanne Krepps will have everything you need to help stuff the Cancer Pillows that the Charity Bee has been working on. I believe there are also "port protectors" to stuff. The pillow and port protectors are so appreciated by the women (and men) who have undergone, or are undergoing, treatment for breast cancer. Besides doing a good deed, it is a time to chat with your quilting friends to catch up on what's going on in their lives. Let's try to beat last year's record for the number of pillows we can stuff.

May13, 2025

Our May meeting brings Teresa Duryea Wong, from Houston, who will speak to us about the history of Native American Quilts. The lecture will encompass the time frame of the 1880's until 2022. During the 1880s, Native American Tribes were relocated, traditional Tribal lands were confiscated, and numerous educational changes happened. During the next several decades, Indigenous people learned to adapt. Missionary women made their way into the Indigenous communities, bringing their quilting skills, fabrics and materials. The Native American women, were already adept with needle skills, easily adopted the patchwork patterns, and soon incorporated their own cultural heritage. I am excited to see quilts from Teresa's collection, and I hope we can find new ideas to inspire us.

Blanco Quilters on the Square Bus Trip to Homestead Heritage in Waco

Homestead Heritage — where the past enriches the future, and the spirit of community thrives. For more information visit: http://www.homesteadheritage.com . The day will include a guided craft village tour, lunch, time to visit the Homestead shops, then time at the Heritage Quilt Barn (http://heritagequiltbarn.com).

Bus departs from Blanco at 8 AM on Thursday, April 10th and returns to Blanco at approximately 8 PM.

Deadline to sign up: April 5, 2025

Costs:

Bus trip: \$50.00 for bus payable by cash or check prior to April 5. Fee includes bus driver gratuity.

Guided tour: \$15.00 cash or check payable to Homestead Heritage (will be collected on the bus trip)

Lunch at Café Homestead (on your own)

To sign up complete the form on the next page. Reservations are on a first come/first pay basis. You may call, text or email Dawn Cochran to hold a seat, though your seat will not be confirmed until payment is received. If sending by USPS it is encouraged that you mail it by March 31st.

Additional information:

The bus holds 56 passengers and has a wheelchair lift

The bus is air-conditioned and has a lavatory

You are responsible for any drinks or snacks for the driving trip. No glass containers. You are responsible for maintaining a clean seating area and putting trash into the appropriate receptacle.

Departure time is 8 AM from the parking lot at Elm and 4th Street in Blanco. (one block west from the stop light at 281 and 4th Street); arrive prior to 8 AM as that is our departure time!

The trip takes approx. 2.5-3 hours with no planned stops for food or bathrooms

The craft tour will include pottery making, glassblowing, fiber crafts and if time permits a visit to the historic grist-mill.

The Heritage Quilt Barn is an All Texas Shop Hop store, so bring along your All Texas Shop Hop passport and get it stamped!
